Minutes of the Annual General Meeting of the Oakville Horticultural Society held in McMillan Hall on the 8th Day of December, 2014

Call to Order:

The Chair called the meeting to order at 8:07 p.m. It was moved by John Comber that the circulated agenda be adopted. The members consented to it as written. A motion to approve the minutes of the December 9, 2013 AGM meeting was made by Celia Roberts and carried.

President's Speech:

Stuart Gough addressed the members and briefed them about the accomplishments of the OHS during the last year. He noted the society's contribution to Family Day, the exemplary Junior Gardener Program, the Plant Sale, and Garden Tour, the Speaker series, the Floral, Horticultural and Photography Shows, and the society's Community Gardens including the *Garden for Life* and new *Fields of Spring* Project. He encouraged all members to become involved in the activities of the society

Treasurer's Report:

The Chair requested that the Treasurer present the audited Financial Report for 2013-2014. Florenda Tingle moved that the financial statement of October 31, 2014 be accepted. The motion carried.
